

SUPERVISION AUTHORITY Community Pharmacy Environment*

The table below outlines the supervision authority for each OCP registrant class – who can supervise them, and who they can supervise – in a community pharmacy environment.

Supervision must always be direct supervision (i.e., supervisor is physically present), unless otherwise indicated.

Intern technician	 Part A pharmacist, or Pharmacist (emergency assignment), or Part A pharmacy technician, or Pharmacy technician (emergency assignment) 	Authority to supervise pharmacy assistants is at the discretion of the employer, Designated Manager or pharmacy manager
NON-REGISTERED PHARMACY PERSON	INEL	
Pharmacy student***	Part A pharmacist, or Pharmacist (emergency assignment)	Authority to supervise pharmacy assistants is at the discretion of the employer, Designated Manager or pharmacy manager
Pharmacy technician student	 Part A pharmacist, or Pharmacist (emergency assignment), or Part A pharmacy technician, or Pharmacy technician (emergency assignment) 	Authority to supervise pharmacy assistants is at the discretion of the employer, Designated Manager or pharmacy manager
Pharmacy assistant	 Part A pharmacist, or Pharmacist (emergency assignment), or Part A pharmacy technician, or Pharmacy technician (emergency assignment) 	Authority to supervise other pharmacy assistants is at the discretion of the employer, Designated Manager or pharmacy manager

^{*}As laid out in the *Drug and Pharmacies Regulation Act*, 1990 only Part A pharmacists or pharmacists (emergency assignment) can supervise the area of the community pharmacy where drugs are kept.
